THINGS TO DO ON THE MISSISSIPPI GULF COAST

FOR FAMILIES:

- Explore a treehouse at Gulfport's Lynn Meadows Discovery Center, a nationallyrecognized children's museum featuring indoor and outdoor spaces for exploring and creating.
- Touch a rocket at Pearlington's INFINITY Science Center, a science museum featuring science-related exhibits plus hands-on experiments.
- Climb aboard a train at Gulfport's Mississippi Coast Model Railroad Museum, featuring more than 80 model train layouts, a train for little ones to ride, and interactive train sets that kids can operate themselves.
- Come face to face with a dolphin at Gulfport's Mississippi Aquarium, featuring 12 fresh and salt-water habitats and more than 200 species of aquatic animals.



FOR ACTIVE TYPES:

- Take a ferry to Ship Island, 11 miles off the coast, part of the Gulf Islands National Seashore and protected by the U.S. Park Service. Activities include swimming, hiking, shelling, and exploring Fort Massachusetts on the island.
- Rent aqua cycles, jet skis, kayaks, paddleboards and more. Fish off a pier or out on the deep sea with a charter company.
- Learn about birds and wildlife at the Pascagoula River Audubon Center, which includes aquaria, a fine art gallery, and a native plant botanical garden.







FOR HISTORY BUFFS:

- Gain perspective at Biloxi's Maritime & Seafood Industry Museum, which preserves and interprets the history and heritage of the Mississippi Gulf Coast, from the time of the first Indian settlement.
- See for miles at the top of Biloxi's famed lighthouse, the town's signature landmark built in 1848, which stands 65 feet tall overlooking the Gulf of Mexico.
- Visit Mississippi's oldest structure, the LaPointe-Krebs House & Museum, which has been scientifically dated as the oldest standing structure in Mississippi. Built in 1757 during the French Colonial period, the structure pre-dates the American Revolutionary War by two decades.
- Follow history along the Mississippi Blues Trail and the Mississippi Freedom Trail markers that dot the coast.



FOR ARTS ENTHUSIASTS:

- Immerse yourself in the world of artist Walter Anderson (1903-1965) at Ocean Springs' Walter Anderson Museum of Art. Stand inside his largest 3-dimensional mural at the Ocean Springs Community Center, adjacent to the museum.
- Appreciate the ceramic art of the self-proclaimed "Mad Potter of Biloxi," George Ohr (1857-1918), at Biloxi's Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art. The museum's unique buildings were designed by noted American architect Frank O. Gehry.
- Support local art at Ocean Springs' Mary C. O'Keefe Cultural Arts Center featuring two local art galleries, the Duckett Gallery and the Local Creatives Gallery. In the same building, explore the History of Ocean Springs Museum, and the Senator Trent Lott Performing Arts Theatre.
